May the Lord, whose birth we will once more celebrate, enable us to become more generous stewards.

CHRISTMAS FOOD DISTRIBUTION

At Christmas we have a special opportunity to share what we have with those in need by contributing to the food baskets. There are biblical reasons why we do this as a congregation and why each person

should contribute. As a church, our mission statement indicates that we confess by word and deed. First, it says we are to proclaim the gospel. This follows Jesus' command to make disciples of all nations (Matthew 28:19) and to be his witnesses to the ends of the earth (Acts 1:8). About half of the families on the list have no church affiliation. Each basket contains information about our church and a *Portals of Prayer*. It may be their only chance to read God's word and hear the gospel. Second, our mission statement says we are to confess by deed. We are to show Christ's love by our actions, and as a church we show the community what it means to be a follower of Jesus. He said, "All men will know that you are my disciples if you love one another" (John 13:35). The early church gave to anyone in need. As a result, they enjoyed "the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved" (Acts 2:45, 47).

There are also biblical reasons why each person should participate. First, God commands us to help the poor. Some people consider it optional, but, according to the Bible, it is a requirement. When John the Baptist told people to share their food (Luke 3:11), he was not saying to be extra nice; he was preaching repentance. The Old Testament laws demanded it. In Deuteronomy 14 God says that a collection should be made to help the poor. Part of the tithe was to help the widows, the orphans, and the aliens (Deuteronomy 14:28-29; 26:12). God also said, "You shall not strip your vineyard bare, or gather the fallen grapes of your vineyard; you shall leave them for the poor and the alien: I am the LORD your God" (Leviticus 19:10, NRSV). The principle is that one should not retain all of one's profits or possessions. Some should be given to

those in need. Even Job knew this. He said, “If I have denied the desires of the poor or let the eyes of the widow grow weary, if I have kept my bread to myself, not sharing it with the fatherless ... then let my arm fall from the shoulder, let it be broken off at the joint. For I dreaded destruction from God, and for fear of his splendor I could not do such things” (Job 31:16-17, 22-23). He acknowledges that these are sins that would deserve to be judged (Job 31:28). The New Testament also has many admonitions to care for the poor. James reminds us that “religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself from being polluted by the world” (James 1:27). Another reason for caring for the poor is that it imitates God’s character. When Moses gave God’s law to the Israelites, he used this as a reason. He said, “He defends the cause of the fatherless and the widow, and loves the alien, giving him food and clothing” (Deuteronomy 10:18). As Christians we have another motivation. At Christmas we remember a Savior who became poor so that we could become rich (2 Corinthians 8:9). He lived a righteous life in our place and took the punishment that we deserve. When we remember that we are saved by grace, we will respond in love toward God and service to others.

As we prepare for the coming of Christmas, and as we plan our special dinners and celebrations, let us share with those who are struggling due to health or financial problems. Your contributions of food, time, and money will be greatly appreciated.

Ways To Help

1. Pack A Sack

If you would like to donate all the food needed for a family, pick up a bag with a list of required items attached. Fill the bag with the requested items and return it to the church or school by Wednesday, December 15. Bags will be available at church on Sundays and at the school office during the week.

2. Donate Individual Items

If you want to donate individual cans or boxes of nonperishable food, you may do that. The following items are needed: canned vegetables (corn, green beans), yams, potatoes, rice, fruit, cranberry sauce, gravy, stuffing, soups, canned meat (such as tuna), pasta, and tomato sauce. In particular, there is a need for low salt or no salt items. At the church food may be placed in the baskets in the narthex and in the basement. At the school food may be placed in designated boxes in the breezeway. Please bring all items to the church or school by Wednesday, December 15.

3. Donate A Turkey

Donations of turkeys are also appreciated. If anyone would like to donate a turkey, we need to know in advance. Please call Daniel Wuerdeman at 718-816-6461 or the church office at 718-761-1600 by December 16.

4. Help with Sorting and Packing

Volunteers are also needed to help with sorting and packing the food. If you would like to help in this way, stay after the service on Wednesday, December 15 or call Daniel Wuerdeman at 718-816-6461.

5. Donate Money

Donations of money may be placed in the Hunger Box on Sundays or sent to the church office. Checks should be made payable to St. John's Lutheran Church and designated for Hunger.

6. Deliver Food

Most of the food will be picked up, but some baskets will need to be delivered. If you can help in this way, call Daniel Wuerdeman at 718-816-6461.

CHRISTMAS TOY DRIVE

Again this year St. John's will be giving toys to children in needy families. A table will be set up in the church basement following the worship service every Sunday from November 21 through December 12. If you would like to donate a gift, come to the table, select a child, and return a new toy for that child. Please wrap the gift, affix the label with the child's name and number, and return it by Sunday, December 12. Your generosity will be appreciated.
